The court quickly found The Dreyfus guilty of treason. He was sentenced to life imprisonment. At a public ceremony on January 5, 1895, Dreyfus was dishonorably discharged and demoted. As (according with tradition) his stripes were torn and his sword was broken, Dreyfus maintained his innocence, crying out:
